

Whole School Curriculum Enrichment and Cultural Capital Enhancement



In November we celebrate Family Week to include the 'anti-bullying' Theme.

We have close links with our Police Liaison Officer and PCSO to support children in learning about keeping safe on-line and in the wider world.



Pupils experience a range of 'Educational Visits' to enhance their curriculum. Examples include; The Black Country Museum, Tamworth Castle and Tudor World. We also do visits to places of worship such as a Church, Mosque and Gurdwara. Children in upper Key Stage 2 have the opportunity to go on a Residential trip.



Children have regular sessions in our Forest School. Sessions are closely linked to our wider curriculum to enable children to deepen their understanding of learning in other subject areas such as Science, Geography and History.



At Gilbertstone we have a School Council where all children are members. Our sessions help children to debate and use a range of essential skills such as listening, leadership and presenting. Pupil voice contributes to decision making,



Each year we take part in the NSPCC Speak Out, Stay Safe campaign to support children in speaking out, being heard and knowing where to get help.

We link with Skills Builder to provide lessons and 'Challenge Days' that help children to develop essential skills such as listening, staying positive and teamwork.



Pupils have the opportunity to take part in a range of workshops such as Living History, Dance, Music and Drama. In addition to this the workshops cover some important themes like Anti Bullying and Staying Safe online.



In the Summer Term the children get creative during our 'Arts week'. A whole school theme is chosen for the week.



In March we take part in Science Week to make links to Science and Technology, as well as developing links to the RHE curriculum.



Across the year learning is enhanced through opportunities that engage our families. Opportunities include; class assemblies, homework projects and parent/carer showcases. Here children can share their skills and knowledge and provide memorable experiences to embed their learning.



We provide a range of after school clubs for children to take part in including multi-sports and a choir

In February children take part in Safer Internet Day as a valuable reminder of how to stay safe in an increasingly technological world.
